The structure of the discipline is based on the following types of language skills, aspects of language, and academic disciplines: - Speaking, listening, reading; - Writing and translation; - Vocabulary and grammar (studied on speech examples, in the process of working on which students develop pronunciation and communicative skills). - Country study: History and culture of the countries where German is spoken; some questions of German literature. Its main objectives are to: - Develop an ability to use the language effectively for practical communication; - Develop communicative competence of students; - Develop language skills of listening, reading, speaking and writing; - Teach grammatical correctness of language use in oral and written forms; - Offer insights into the culture and civilisation of countries where German is spoken; - Encourage positive attitudes towards language learning and towards speakers of foreign languages; - Form a sound base of the skills, language and attitudes required for progression to work or further study Learning outcomes:

<p>Grading Policy, Methods of Assessment</p>	<p>Elements of final grade:</p> <p>Active participation in seminar work is on a five-tiered scale (1–5) and comprises 10% of the total mark.</p> <p>Seminar: Detailed explanation of a topic, defining grammatical issues. Evaluation of the detailed topic explanation is on a five-tiered scale (1–5). The definitions of grammatical issues are also on a five-tiered scale (1–5).</p> <p>The grade for active and informed participation includes discussion (quality and quantity), attitude and attendance (you are allowed to miss two scheduled lessons over the semester).</p> <p>The evaluation of seminar test comprises 10% of the total mark.</p> <p>Module test evaluation over the course material comprises 30% of the total mark.</p> <p>The course will be completed with an oral exam.</p> <p>The exam comprises 50% of the final grade.</p> <p>Grading scale: 0-59 fail, 60-74 satisfactory, 75-89 good, 90-100 excellent</p>
